By Mr. Long of Dover, petition of Charles W. Long (by vote of the town) that the town of Norfolk be authorized to appoint certain intermittent police officers to its regular police force. Public Service.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF NORFOLK TO APPOINT CERTAIN INTERMITTENT POLICE OFFICERS TO THE REGULAR FORCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section
2 twenty C of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws, Robert K.
3 Forsberg, Albert A. Leverone and George Katapodis, intermittent
4 police officers of the town of Norfolk who have passed their
5 fiftieth birthdays, may be appointed to the regular police force
6 therein if they shall otherwise be eligible for certification and
7 appointment.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
