AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE JOHN F. KENNEDY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1D of chapter 15 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the twenty-first paragraph the fol-
3 lowing paragraph: —

4 The board is hereby authorized to guarantee the payment of
5 full or partial medical and dental scholarships to a number of
6 particularly needy students selected in their second or third
7 undergraduate years by persons or agencies of the board's
8 designation under such regulations as the board shall deem
9 necessary. Said scholarships, to be known as the John F.
10 Kennedy Memorial Scholarships, shall be guaranteed to the
11 student at the time of his selection, provided he satisfactorily
12 completes his undergraduate work and will be payable from the
13 funds appropriated for the purposes of the preceding paragraph
14 at the time of his matriculation at any approved school of
15 Medicine or Dentistry of his choice. Such needy students shall
16 be chosen based on economic factors which would prevent
17 medical or dental school matriculation without such assistance
18 from the commonwealth or from such other agency.
