

SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its acceptance by vote of the city council of the city of Boston, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.

*Chap.201* AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF DUKES COUNTY TO BORROW MONEY FOR IMPROVING THE COUNTY AIRPORT.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The county commissioners of the county of Dukes county may expend, for the purpose of improving the public airport operated by said county, a sum not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. For the purposes aforesaid, the treasurer of said county, with the approval of the county commissioners, may borrow upon the credit of the county such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, fifty thousand dollars, and may issue notes of the county therefor, which shall bear on their face the words, Dukes County Airport Loan, Act of 1957. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan, and such loans shall be payable in not more than four years from their dates. Such notes shall be signed by the treasurer of the county and countersigned by a majority of the county commissioners. The county may sell said securities at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as the county commissioners may deem proper, but not for less than their par value. Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall, except as herein provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of the General Laws.

*Chap.202* AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH MINIMUM WAGE BOARDS SHALL SUBMIT REPORTS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The first paragraph of section 7 of chapter 151 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 432 of the acts of 1947, is hereby amended by striking out the first two sentences and inserting in place thereof the following three sentences: — Within ninety days of its organization a wage board shall submit a report including its recommendations as to minimum fair wage rates for persons in the occupation or occupations the wage rates of which the wage board was appointed to investigate. Upon the request of a wage board the commission may grant an extension of time, not to exceed thirty days, for the submission of said report. If the report is not submitted within said ninety days or said extension of time, the commission shall constitute a new wage board.
