AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MILITARY SERVICE PERFORMED BY CERTAIN EMPLOYEES BE COUNTED AS CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR PURPOSES OF RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The third subparagraph (h) of subdivision (1) of section 4 of
2 chapter 32 of the General Laws is amended by adding the
3 following sentence: — Any member who is a veteran as defined in
4 section (1) having not less than twenty years accumulative service
5 in the commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions shall be
6 granted creditable service up to four years for military service
7 performed.

Report of the Commission on Governmental Reorganization

AN ACT TO REORGANIZE THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That

- 1 The title organization of the Executive Branch of the Government of the District of Columbia shall be reorganized in accordance with the following provisions:
- 2 Section 25 of the General Law is amended to read as follows:
- 3 following matters: - Any person who has been appointed to any position in the Executive Branch of the Government of the District of Columbia shall be appointed to that position by the Commission on Governmental Reorganization.
- 4 Section 26 being out of harmony with the provisions of the General Law shall be amended to read as follows:
- 5 in the Commission on Governmental Reorganization.
- 6 general creditable service up to four years for reappointment.
- 7 continued.
