AN ACT TO FURTHER REGULATE LEGISLATIVE AGENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 3 of the General Laws, as most recently enacted by
- 2 chapter 981 of the statutes of 1973, is hereby amended by
- 3 adding to section 49 thereof the following paragraph: —
- 4 Nothing in sections thirty-nine through forty-nine of chapter
- 5 three of the General Laws shall: —
- 6 (a) be construed to permit any person to engage in the
- 7 practice of law, except as provided under the provisions of
- 8 section forty-six A of chapter two hundred twenty-one of the
- 9 General Laws;
- 10 (b) be construed to apply to any person lawfully practicing
- 11 law before any member or agency of the Executive branch of the
- 12 commonwealth;
- 13 (c) apply to any attorney-at-law or bar association when
- 14 appearing before any committee of the legislature conducting a
- 15 public hearing, investigation, impeachment proceeding, or other
- 16 public action on behalf of a client or upon the request of a
- 17 member of the legislature, provided any such attorney makes
- 18 known his name and address and the client for whom he
- 19 appears; .
