## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Four.

### AN ACT ALLOWING PUBLIC INSPECTION OF RECORDS OF DELINQUENCY CASES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 119 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 striking out section 60A, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 174  
3 of the Acts of 1938, and inserting in place thereof the following  
4 section: —

5 *Section 60A.* The records of the court or the superior court  
6 on appeal in all cases of waywardness or delinquency arising  
7 under sections fifty-two to fifty-nine, inclusive, shall not be  
8 withheld from public inspection.
