AN ACT GRANTING CERTAIN SICK LEAVE CREDIT TO JOHN F.M.
KEANE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any law, the department
2 of public welfare shall grant to John F.M. Keane for sick leave
3 purposes, full credit for sick leave credit accrued by him while
4 an employee of the welfare departments of Stoughton, Saugus
5 and Arlington from May twenty-first, nineteen hundred and
6 fifty-one, to April nineteen hundred and fifty-six.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1, Clause 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including all bound Persons for the Space of one Year, who shall have arrived in the United States before the next Enumeration of the same, three fifths of the Number of all other Persons who shall have arrived in the United States before the next Enumeration of the same, excluding Indians not taxed.
