AN ACT DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONSTRUCT AN ENCLOSED TENNIS COMPLEX OF THIRTY TENNIS COURTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to construct, care for and maintain a recreational
- 3 facility, suitable for not less than thirty enclosed tennis courts
- 4 which in the discretion of the commission would be considered
- 5 for the best convenience of all the community. For said purposes,
- 6 said commission may expend such sums as may be appropriated
- 7 therefor.
