AN ACT CREATING A BOARD TO EXAMINE, LICENSE AND REGULATE MASONS AND BRICKLAYERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 13 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 79 the following section: —
3 *Section 80.* The state examiner of masons and bricklayers,
4 hereinafter called the board, shall consist of the director of civil
5 service, the chairman of the board of registration of architects,
6 the chairman of the board of professional engineers and of land
7 surveyors, the associate commissioner for the division of occupa-
8 tional engineering in the department of education, ex officiiis,
9 and four persons to be appointed for terms of three years each
10 by the governor. One of said appointees shall be a representative
11 of the public, subject to the provisions of section nine B. Each of
12 the three appointees shall be master masons. The board shall
13 appoint from its own membership a chairman and secretary at its
14 first meeting of the year, each to serve for a term of one year.
15 The board shall from time to time make rules and regulations
16 relative to the examination, licensing and maintenance of high
17 standards of competence and craftsmanship within the trade.
