AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MEMBERS OF SCHOOL COMMITTEES MAY
BECOME MEMBERS OF THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to he contrary, members
2 of school committees may become members of the retirement
3 system in accordance with the provisions of chapter thirty-two of
4 the General Laws, provided that they pay into the annuity
5 savings fund five per cent of the amount they would have paid in
6 had their salary during their period of service been established at
7 two thousand dollars per annum.
