

*Chap.491* AN ACT EXEMPTING INTEREST DERIVED FROM DEPOSITS IN ANY BANKING COMPANY OR MORRIS PLAN COMPANY FROM THE TAXATION OF INCOME FROM CERTAIN INTANGIBLES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of section 1 of chapter 62 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out paragraph First, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

First, Deposits in any savings bank chartered by the commonwealth, in any banking company or Morris Plan company subject to the provisions of chapter one hundred and seventy-two A, or in the Massachusetts Hospital Life Insurance Company, or in the savings department of any trust company so chartered, and deposits in any bank situated in the state of New Hampshire, so long as the provisions of chapter one hundred and eighty-nine of the Public Acts of nineteen hundred and seventeen of that state remain in force, and deposits in any bank in any other state which exempts from taxation to its inhabitants similar deposits, and interest and dividends thereon, owned by such inhabitants in banks in this commonwealth.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January first, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, and shall apply to income received in the calendar year nineteen hundred and fifty-seven and thereafter.

*Chap.492* AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION OF GRADUATES OF FOREIGN SCHOOLS WHO ARE APPLICANTS FOR REGISTRATION AS VETERINARIANS.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 55 of chapter 112 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph, as most recently amended by section 24 of chapter 585 of the acts of 1952, and inserting in place thereof the following two paragraphs:—Applications for registration as veterinarians, signed and sworn to by the applicant, shall be made upon blanks furnished by the board. Each applicant who shall furnish the board with satisfactory proof that he is twenty-one years of age or over, of good moral character, that he possesses the educational qualifications required for graduation from a public high school, that he has completed one year of collegiate work, including chemistry and biology, in a college or university approved by a body consisting of the secretary of the board and the director of the division of livestock disease control of the department of agriculture, in this section referred to as the approving authority, that he has attended courses of instruction for four years of not less than thirty-two school weeks in each year, or courses which in the opinion of the board are equivalent thereto, in one or more legally chartered schools of veterinary medicine, and that he has received the degree of doctor of veterinary
