**AN ACT REQUIRING THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH TO FILE CERTAIN COPIES OF DOCUMENTS WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND DEVELOPMENT.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 13 of chapter 155 of the General Laws  
2 as most recently amended by chapter 695 of the acts of 1949, is  
3 hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following  
4 paragraph:

5 A copy of the first page of said articles shall be forwarded by  
6 the Secretary upon his approval to the Commissioner of the  
7 Department of Commerce and Development and shall be kept on  
8 file by said Commissioner. The Secretary shall forward annually  
9 to the said Commissioner a list of all dissolved corporations.
