**AN ACT AMENDING THE LAW REGARDING FORTIFIED SKIMMED MILK.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 12A of chapter 94, as most recently amended, is  
2 hereby further amended by deleting the first sentence and  
3 inserting the following sentence in place thereof: “ ‘Fortified  
4 Nonfat Milk’, ‘Fortified Skimmed Milk’, ‘Fortified Low Fat Milk’  
5 shall be made from nonfat milk, skimmed milk or low fat milk,  
6 which come from sources approved for sale in the Common-  
7 wealth, to which sufficient nonfat milk solids have been added,  
8 so that the total nonfat milk solids will not be less than ten  
9 percent by weight.”
