RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES RELATIVE TO PROVIDING AN ACCESS ROAD FROM THE SOUTHEAST EXPRESSWAY TO THE TOWN OF SCITUATE.

1 Resolved, That the department of public works and the
2 department of natural resources, acting jointly, are hereby
3 authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of
4 the possibility and desirability of constructing an access road
5 from the Southeast Expressway to the town of Scituate. Said
6 departments shall confer with a committee of ten members, one
7 of whom shall be the chairman of the Route 228 study
8 committee, one of whom shall be the chairman of the boards of
9 selectmen of the town of Cohasset, the town of Hingham, the
10 town of Norwell, and the town of Scituate, and five of whom
11 shall be the chairmen of the conservation commissions of said
12 above name towns, and the chairman of the North and South
13 River Watershed Commission, to assist them in their delibera-
14 tions. Said departments shall report to the general court the
15 results of their investigation and study, and their recommenda-
16 tions, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
17 their recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the
18 clerk of the house of representatives on or before the last
19 Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and seventy-four.
