AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH AN EMPLOYMENT POLICY GIVING PRIORITY TO LOCAL RESIDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The Massachusetts Port Authority is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to establish an employment policy giving priority to

By the following a permanent commission is hereby created for the purpose of studying and reporting to the Senate on the subject of the organization and functions of the various departments of the Executive branch of the Government, and on the subject of the organization and functions of the various departments of the Legislative branch of the Government, and on the subject of the organization and functions of the various departments of the Judicial branch of the Government.

The Organization of the Executive Branch

10. The Department of Defense
