AN ACT REDUCING THE REQUIRED VOTE FROM TWO-THIRDS TO A MAJORITY FOR CITIES AND TOWNS INCURRING TEMPORARY DEBT FOR THE ACQUISITION OF LAND FOR CONSERVATION OR RECREATION PURPOSES IN ANTICIPATION OF STATE AND FEDERAL REIMBURSEMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 8C of chapter 44 of the General Laws, inserted by  
2 chapter 734 of the acts of 1973, is hereby amended, in line 6,  
3 by inserting after the word "both" the words: — by a majority  
4 vote.
