RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL
COMMISSION RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CHILD LABOR LAWS.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, and one person to be appointed by the governor, is
4 hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation
5 and study relative to a review of all state statutes which per-
6 tain to child labor, whether through school-sponsored pro-
7 grams, or otherwise, as said statutes relate to authorization
8 for school-age or school-attending children to be engaged in
9 programs out of school of a work experience nature. Partic-
10 ular attention shall be paid to the effect of federal rules and
11 regulations on said statutes. Said commission shall be pro-
12 vided with such staff as the president of the senate may al-
13 low, shall be permitted quarters in the State House or else-
14 where. Said commission shall be provided with technical as-
15 sistance from the division of occupational education in the
16 department of education.

7 Said commission shall report the results of its investigation
18 and study and its recommendations, if any, by filing the same
19 with the clerk of the senate on the last Wednesday in De-
20 cember, nineteen hundred and seventy-seven.
