In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-eight.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN REFUSALS BY MANUFACTURER TO SUPPLY PARTS OR SUPPLIES SHALL BE UNLAWFUL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Paragraph (a) of section 2 of chapter 93A of the General
- 2 Laws is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:
- 3 It shall be unlawful under this section for any manufacturer
- 4 doing business in the commonwealth to refuse to sell parts or
- 5 supplies for the products of such manufacturer to a respon-
- 6 sible repair or service person.
