AN ACT PROHIBITING THE FORMATION OF NON-ELECTED POLITICAL COMMITTEES TO FINANCE THE CAMPAIGNS OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES OTHER THAN EXISTING ELECTED OFFICIALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 11 of Chapter 55 of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the second
3 sentence, as appearing in chapter 123 of the acts of 1974 and
4 by inserting in place thereof the following sentence; — No
5 non-elected political committee shall directly or indirectly
6 solicit or receive any gift, payment, contribution, assessment,
7 subscription or promise of money or other thing of value for
8 the political campaign purposes of any candidate for public
9 office who is a person employed for compensation, other than
10 an elected officer, by the commonwealth or any county, city
11 or town.
