The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-eight.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN TO ASSURE LIVING ARRANGEMENTS IN A HOME.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of chapter 18 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding after subsection (C), added by section 12
3 of chapter 1168 of the acts of 1973, the following sub-sec-
4 tion: —

5 (D) The department shall administer throughout the com-
6 monwealth a program of emergency assistance to needy
7 families with children subject to and in accordance with Sec-
8 tion 406(e) of the Social Security Act of 1935 to provide all
9 necessary benefits to avoid destitution or to provide living
10 arrangements in a home. The commonwealth shall accept
11 matching funds from the appropriate federal authorities for
12 the program.
