AN ACT RELATIVE TO INQUIRY INTO THE DESIRABILITY OF CONSTABULATION UNDER THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR, ALL POLICE FORCES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 *Whereas*, each police department unit of the Commonwealth
- 2 enjoys too much autonomy.
- 3 *Be it resolved therefore*, that all police forces throughout
- 4 the Commonwealth be integrated into one statewide body to be
- 5 known as "The State Constabulary".
