By Mr. Tobin, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 897) of Arthur H. Tobin, James A. Sheets and Thomas F. Brownell for legislation to require certification of good moral character of certain employees transporting school children. Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-eight.

AN ACT REQUIRING CERTIFICATION OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES TRANSPORTING SCHOOL CHILDREN.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately protect school children transported in vehicles other than school buses by uncertified persons, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the preservation of the public safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 8A of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as most re-
- 2 cently amended by section 5 of chapter 552 of the acts of 1976,
- 3 is hereby further amended by inserting after the second para-
- 4 graph the following paragraph: —
- 5 Every person who desires to engage in the transporting of
- 6 school pupils for hire in a vehicle other than a school bus, as
- 7 defined in this chapter, shall obtain from the registrar a cer-
- 8 tificate attesting that he is of good moral character and has, in
- 9 the opinion of the registrar, a safe driving record. Every school
- 10 committee, bus company or other person engaging the services
- 11 of such a driver shall require the presentation of such cer-
- 12 tificate before approving the application of said driver for em-
- 13 ployment.
