Lutfy, president, and Gerard D'Amico for legislation to protect the re-employment rights of an employee who is lowered in rank for lack of work or lack of money or abolition or position. AN ACT TO PROTECT THE REEMPLOYMENT RIGHTS OF AN EMPLOYEE OF THE COMMONWEALTH WHO IS LOWERED IN RANK FOR LACK OF WORK OR LACK OF MONEY OR ABOLITION OF POSITION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. *Section 46G of Chapter 31* of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the
3 following paragraph:

1 SECTION 2. *Section 46I of Chapter 31* of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end of said section the
3 following new paragraph:

4 "This section shall also apply to cases where an employee is
5 lowered in rank for lack of work or lack of money or abolition
6 of position."

THE SENATE is hereby authorized to pass any bill or resolution which may be introduced therein at any time during the session of the Senate.
