AN ACT REQUIRING APPLICANTS FOR LOW INCOME HOUSING TO PROVIDE INCOME AND ASSETS INFORMATION UNDER THE PENALTIES OF PERJURY IN THEIR APPLICATIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 44 of chapter 121B of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by section 14 of chapter 689 of the acts of  
3 1974, is hereby further amended by adding the following  
4 paragraph: —

5 Applications for tenancy in low-rent housing projects or for  
6 lease-holds of units leased by a housing authority under the  
7 rental assistance program shall contain a statement by the  
8 applicant under the penalties of perjury that the information  
9 concerning his income and assets and concerning the income  
10 and assets required in said application as to any other persons  
11 proposed to share the dwelling unit for which the application  
12 is made is true. This statement shall be a condition precedent  
13 to to approval of any such application by a housing authority.
