AN ACT INCREASING THE PENALTY FOR A SECOND CONVICTION OF
THE CRIME OF UNLAWFUL USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 24 of chapter
2 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting, in
3 line 24, as appearing in Chapter 316 of the acts of 1966, after
4 the word "both" the words: — ; provided, however, that in
5 the case of a second conviction thereof, punishment of impris-
6 onment shall be required for a term of not less than six
7 months and the imposition or execution of said sentence shall
8 not be suspended.
