The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN MANDATORY JAIL SENTENCING FOR POSSESSION WITH INTENT TO SELL OR SALE OF CERTAIN CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 94C of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 32 the following section: —
- 3 *Section 32A.* Any person who sells or possesses with intent
- 4 to sell a controlled substance as listed in section thirty-two
- 5 shall be punished by a mandatory imprisonment of one year
- 6 for each five hundred dollars in illegal sales value (street
- 7 value) such substance represents. Any sentence so imposed
- 8 shall not be suspended nor shall any person so convicted be
- 9 eligible for probation parole or furlough or receive any deduc-
- 10 tion from his sentence for good conduct. Prosecution under
- 11 this section shall neither be continued without a finding nor
- 12 placed on file by the court.
