AN ACT AUTHORIZING A LOCAL INSPECTOR OF WIRES TO WORK AS AN ELECTRICIAN AND PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ASSISTANT INSPECTOR TO INSPECT HIS WORK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to permit a local inspector of wires to work as an electrician and providing for the appointment of an additional such inspector to inspect his work, therefore it is declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 166 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 32, the following section:
3 *Section 32A.* No inspector of wires shall inspect or approve
4 any electrical work done by himself, his employer, employee
5 or one employed with him, but a city, town or district may
6 appoint an additional inspector of wires who shall inspect
7 wiring so done. Said additional inspector may act in the
8 absence or disability of the local inspector and for his services
9 shall receive such compensation as the city, town or district
10 shall determine. Said additional inspector shall be a licensed
11 electrician and shall be subject to the provisions of the pre-
12 ceding section. The board of examiners of electricians shall
13 adopt a regulation in conformity with the provisions of this
14 section.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
