AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SIXTY-SEVEN FOR LEONARD O. MACPHAIL, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE IN THE CITY OF LOWELL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provision of any general or special law,
2 or rule or regulation to the contrary, Leonard O. MacPhail,
3 incumbent of the office of the chief of police in the city of
4 Lowell shall remain in said office during his good behavior
5 until he reaches age sixty-seven, unless incapacitated by phy-
6 sical or mental disability from performing the duties thereof,
7 but he may be removed therefrom for cause after a hearing
8 in the manner provided by section forty-three of chapter
9 thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provision of any general or
2 special law, or rule or regulation to the contrary, regulating
3 the age requirement for retirement, said Leonard O. MacPhail,
4 notwithstanding the fact that he has attained age sixty-five,
5 shall remain in office as chief of police in the city of Lowell
6 and no deductions shall be made from the regular compensa-
7 tion of such member, under the provisions of chapter thirty-
8 two, for service after he has attained age sixty-five, and upon
9 retirement such member shall receive a superannuation retire-
10 ment allowance equal to that to which he would have been en-
11 titled had he retired at age sixty-five.
