The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-one.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING A CUSHING HOSPITAL OUTLAY BOND ISSUE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying out the
2 provisions of this act, the state treasurer shall, upon request
3 of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth
4 to an amount to be specified by the governor from time to
5 time, but not exceeding, in the aggregate, the sum fifty million
6 dollars.

7 All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as aforesaid, shall
8 be designated on their face, Cushing Renovation Capital Out-
9 lay Act of 1981, and shall be issued for such maximum terms
10 of years, not exceeding twenty years, as the governor may
11 recommend to the General Court pursuant to section three
12 of article LXII of the amendments to the constiution of the
13 commonwealth, provided, however, that all such bonds shall
14 be payable not later than June thirtieth, two thousand and
15 five. All interest and payments on account of principal of
16 such obligations shall be payable from the general fund. Bonds
17 and the interest thereon issued under the authority of this
18 section shall, notwithstanding any other provisions of this
19 act, be general obligations of the commonwealth.

The Constitution of the Commonwealth

Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor and Council.
