**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT PLACING THE CHIEF, ASSISTANT CHIEF AND THE DEPUTY CHIEFS OF FIRE TRAINING IN GROUP 4 UNDER THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (g) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of chapter 32  
 2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the  
 3 definition of *Group 4* and inserting in place thereof the fol-  
 4 lowing definition: —

5 *Group 4.* Division of law enforcement, office of the secre-  
 6 tary of the executive office of environmental affairs; officials  
 7 and employees of the registry of motor vehicles appointed by  
 8 the registrar under section twenty-nine of chapter ninety;  
 9 capitol police; members of the state police detectives appointed  
 10 under section six of chapter twenty-two, serving in any divi-  
 11 sion of the department of public safety; members of the police  
 12 force of the metropolitan district commission; employees of  
 13 the Massachusetts Port Authority at the General Edward  
 14 Lawrence Logan International Airport, comprising perma-  
 15 nent crash crewmen, fire control men, assistant fire control  
 16 men; members of police and fire departments not classified  
 17 in *Group 1*; any police officer of the Massachusetts Bay Trans-  
 18 portation Authority; employees whose regular compensation  
 19 is paid by the United States from funds allocated to the Mas-  
 20 sachusetts National Guard and who are regularly and perma-  
 21 nently employed under the control of the military departement  
 22 of the commonwealth and whose duties in such employment  
 23 require substantially all normal working hours and whose con-

24 tinued employment is based upon recognition in the Massa-  
25 chusetts National Guard; employees of a municipal gas or  
26 electric generating or distribution plant who are employed  
27 as linemen, electric switchboard operators, electric mainte-  
28 nance men, steam engineers, boiler operators, firemen, oilers,  
29 mechanical maintenance men, and supervisors of said em-  
30 ployees; employees of the department of correction who are  
31 employed at any correctional institution or prison camp under  
32 the control of said department and who hold the position of  
33 correction officer, female correction officer, industrial insruc-  
34 tor, recreation officer, assistant industrial shop manager, in-  
35 dustrial shop manager, assistant to the supervisor of indus-  
36 tries, senior correction office, senior female correction officer,  
37 supervising correction officer, supervising female correction  
38 officer, prison camp officer, senior prison camp officer, super-  
39 vising prison camp officer, assistant deputy superintendent  
40 chief of security for the University of Massachusetts medical  
41 school or supervising identification agent; employees who hold  
42 the position of state hospital steward in the department of  
43 correction; the sheriff, superintendent, assistant superinten-  
44 dent, assistant deputy superintendent and correction officers  
45 of county correctional facilities; the chief fire warden and dis-  
46 trict fire wardens in the executive office of environmental af-  
47 fairs; and the chief, assistant chief and the deputy chiefs of  
48 fire training in the bureau of fire training in the division of  
49 occupational education in the department of education.
