AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE STATE ASSUMPTION OF THE ENTIRE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH MEDICAL EXAMINERS FROM COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 38 of the General Laws as
2 most recently amended by Section 5 of chapter 941 of the acts
3 of 1977 is hereby amended by striking out lines 27, 28, and
4 29 and inserting in place thereof: — “Compensation for such
5 temporary service shall be provided by the Commonwealth.”

1 SECTION 2. Section 5 of chapter 38 of the General Laws as
2 most recently amended by sections 6 and 7 of chapter 941 of
3 the acts of 1977 is hereby amended by striking out in line 18:
4 “shall be paid by said County” and inserting in place thereof:
5 “the Commonwealth” and striking out the remaining para-
6 graph after the word “duty”.

7 Section 6 of chapter 38 of the General Laws as most recent-
8 ly amended by section 6 of chapter 941 of the acts of 1977 is
9 hereby amended by striking out in line 60 the word “County”
10 and inserting in place thereof “the Commonwealth”.

11 Section 5 of chapter 38 of the General Laws as most recent-
12 ly amended by sections 6 and 7 of chapter 941 of the acts of
13 1977 is hereby amended by inserting before the first sentence
14 etc. the following sentence: —

15 “All salaries, expenses and fees associated with the duties
16 of medical examiners shall be assumed completely by the
17 Commonwealth.”

1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 1982.
