**AN ACT TO PROVIDE UP-TO-DATE, FACTUAL DRUG EDUCATION
STATEWIDE.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 4 of Chapter 70 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by Section 11 of Chapter 492 of the Acts of
3 1974 is hereby further amended by adding the following para-
4 graph: —

5 All cities, towns and districts shall receive up-to-date, fac-
6 tual drug education on marihuana and other illegal drugs.
7 Presentations and educational materials shall focus on the ad-
8 verse physiological, psychological, and social effects of drug
9 use.
