**AN ACT MAKING ANNUAL HEARINGS FOR RENEWAL OF MOTOR
VEHICLE JUNK LICENSES DISCRETIONARY WITH THE LICENSING
BOARD OR OFFICER.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 adding after section 59 the following new section: —
- 3 *Section 59A.* Notwithstanding the provisions of section 58
- 4 in a city, town, or district which accepts this section, as here-
- 5 inafter provided, the annual hearing for renewal of class 3
- 6 licenses issued under the provisions of section 58 may be dis-
- 7 pensed with under the discretion of the licensing board or
- 8 officer.

SECTION 1. The following sections of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi are hereby amended:

THE CONSTITUTION OF MISSISSIPPI

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-NINE

AND THE SEVENTH SECTION OF THE ARTICLE IN WHICH THE WORDS "ARTICLE" AND "SECTION" ARE USED SHALL BE DELETED.

THE SECTIONS OF THE CONSTITUTION OF MISSISSIPPI WHICH ARE REFERRED TO IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:
