AN ACT PLACING CERTAIN EMPLOYEES IN GROUP 2 OF THE  
CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (g) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of chapter 32  
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the  
3 definition of Group 2, as most recently amended by section  
4 88 and section 134 of chapter 329 of the acts of 1980, and in-  
5 serting in place thereof the following definition: —

6 *Group 2.* Public works building police, permanent water-  
7 shed guards and permanent park police; University of Massa-  
8 chusetts police; all court officers having police powers; em-  
9 ployees of the Massachusetts Port Authority, comprising  
10 guards, guard sergeants, head guard and chief of waterfront  
11 police; officials and employees of the department of public  
12 safety having police powers; employees of a municipal de-  
13 partment who are employed as fire or police signal operators  
14 or signal maintenance repairmen; ambulance attendants of  
15 a municipal department who are required to respond to fires  
16 and perform duties assigned to them; employees of a city or  
17 town who are employed as licensed electricians and elevator  
18 maintenance men employed by a county; employees of Cush-  
19 ing Hospital; employees of the commonwealth or of any  
20 county, regardless of any official classification, except the  
21 sheriff, superintendent, deputy superintendent, assistant  
22 deputy superintendent, and correction officers of any county  
23 correctional facilities whose regular and major duties require

24 them to have care, custody, instruction, or other supervision  
 25 of prisoners; and employees of the commonwealth or of any  
 26 county whose regular and major duties require them to have  
 27 the care and custody, instruction or other supervision of  
 28 parolees or persons who are mentally ill or mentally defec-  
 29 tive delinquents or wayward children; provided, that no mem-  
 30 ber who attains age sixty-five while classified in Group 1  
 31 may thereafter be classified in Group 2, irrespective of change  
 32 of employment.
