AN ACT TO INCREASE THE PENALTIES FOR CAUSING THE DEATH OR PERMANENT INJURY OF A PERSON WHILE DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 24G of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended
2 by Chapter 227 of the Acts of 1976, is hereby amended by
3 inserting after the word "both" the following: —

4 and, notwithstanding any section of this chapter to the con-
5 trary, shall lose the right to be licensed to operate a motor
6 vehicle in the Commonwealth for not less than five years nor
7 more than life.

8 Whoever, upon any way or in any place to which the public
9 has a right of access, or upon any way or in any places to
10 which members of the public have access as invitees or li-
11 censees, operates a motor vehicle recklessly or negligently so
12 that the lives or safety of the public might be endangered,
13 and by such operation causes the permanent injury of another
14 person shall, notwithstanding any section of this chapter to
15 the contrary, lose the right to be licensed to operate a motor
16 vehicle in the Commonwealth for not less than five years.
