AN ACT PERMITTING THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY OF THE SUFFOLK DISTRICT TO CONTINUE TO EMPLOY POLICE OFFICERS OF THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR POLICE AND DETECTIVE SERVICES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section twenty-one of chapter twelve of the General Laws,
- 2 as inserted by section five of chapter four-hundred and sixty
- 3 of the acts of 1906, is hereby amended by striking the first
- 4 sentence thereof and substituting the following: —
- 5 The superintendent of police of Boston shall, upon the writ-
- 6 ten request of the district attorney for the Suffolk District
- 7 and with the approval of the chief justice of the superior court
- 8 department of the trial court, detail inspectors or police offi-
- 9 cers for police and detective service under the direction of the
- 10 district attorney.
