

ACTS, 1980. - Chaps. 277, 278.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The county treasurer of the county of Plymouth, with the approval of the county commissioners of said county, is hereby authorized to pay from any available funds the unfunded portions of the collective bargaining agreement between the county of Plymouth and the International Brotherhood of Correction Officers for the period from July first, nineteen hundred and seventy-eight through June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty, in an amount not to exceed forty-nine thousand five hundred and fifty-three dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 277. AN ACT DIRECTING THE COUNTY TREASURER OF ESSEX COUNTY TO PAY FOR CERTAIN SERVICES FOR CERTAIN TEACHERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the county treasurer of Essex county is hereby authorized and directed to pay from any available funds to William Clark, one hundred thirty-two dollars and forty-one cents, Joan Hoyt, five hundred thirty dollars and forty cents, Russell Small, eight hundred fifty-three dollars and ninety-two cents, and to Edward A. Ferguson, eight hundred sixty dollars and sixty-four cents for their services as teachers at Essex Agricultural and Technical Institute from September, nineteen hundred and seventy-seven to June, nineteen hundred and seventy-eight.

SECTION 2. No payment shall be made under the authority of this act unless and until a certificate has been signed and filed with the said county treasurer, stating under the penalties of perjury that such services were rendered to said county.

SECTION 3. Any person who knowingly files a certificate required by section two, which is false, and who thereby receives payment for services which were not rendered to said county shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or both.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 278. AN ACT DESIGNATING A CERTAIN BUILDING LOCATED IN WILLIAM K. WEBB MEMORIAL PARK IN THE TOWN OF WEYMOUTH AS THE EDWARD T. HENLEY MEMORIAL BUILDING.

ACTS, 1980. - Chaps. 279, 280.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The building situated in William K. Webb Memorial park in the town of Weymouth, presently known as the Weymouth Park and Recreation building, shall be designated and known as the Edward T. Henley Memorial building, in memory of Edward T. Henley a lifelong resident of the town of Weymouth, a prominent civic and fraternal leader in said town, and a former member of the Weymouth park commission. A suitable marker bearing such designation shall be erected and maintained on said building by the department of environmental management.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 279. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE TOWN OF CARLISLE TO REFUND CERTAIN MONIES PAID FOR CEMETERY PURPOSES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The board of public works of the town of Carlisle is hereby authorized to refund monies paid by any person for the purchase of burial rights including perpetual care in Green cemetery in said town provided such person, his heirs or assigns, convey back to said town the burial rights, including perpetual care, so purchased.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 280. AN ACT INCREASING THE TIME IN WHICH REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CENTRAL BERKSHIRE COUNTY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION MAY BE EXEMPT FROM TAXATION BY THE CITY OR TOWN IN WHICH IT IS LOCATED.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 712 of the acts of 1963 is hereby amended by striking out section 6, as amended by chapter 435 of the acts of 1972, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 6. The corporation shall not be subject to the provisions of chapter sixty-three of the General Laws, nor to any taxes based upon or measured by income. The securities and evidences of indebtedness issued by the corporation, and income therefrom, shall at all times be free from taxation by the commonwealth. Real property owned by the corporation shall not be subject to taxation by the city or town in which it is located until thirty years from the date of its acquisition or until such
