

By Mr. Goyette of New Bedford, petition of Roger R. Goyette relative to regulating the cancellation of motor vehicle insurance. Insurance.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Four.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE CANCELLATION OF AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (z) of section 113A of chapter 175 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 11 of chapter 266 of the
3 acts of 1976, is hereby further amended by adding the following
4 paragraph: —

5 The company shall not issue a refund upon cancellation of the
6 policy until the insured has presented to the company a receipt or
7 other document showing that he has returned the number plates
8 assigned to the vehicle to the registry of motor vehicles. The
9 company shall, at the time it sends any notice of cancellation,
10 attach thereto a notice that the insured may be subject to suspen-
11 sion of his license to operate motor vehicles if he does not return to
12 the registry of motor vehicles the number plates assigned to the
13 vehicle within ten days of the effective date of cancellation.
