**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Four.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ELIGIBILITY OF COUNCILS ON AGES FOR INSURANCE PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 110I of chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after it the following new section: —

3 Nothing in Sections 108, 110, 133 or 134 shall be construed to  
4 apply to or affect or prohibit the issue of (i) any general or blanket  
5 or group policy of accident and health insurance, or (ii) any group  
6 policy of life insurance, or (iii) any policy of group life and accident  
7 and health insurance, to the trustee or trustees of a fund then  
8 existing or a fund to be established where the trustee or trustees of  
9 such fund are appointed by a council on aging. The policy shall  
10 specify the persons who are eligible for insurance and the  
11 conditions applicable to such insurance. The premiums for the  
12 policy shall be entirely paid for by the persons insured under the  
13 policy. Any return of premium or other monies by the insurance  
14 company to the trustee or trustees shall be applied or used by the  
15 trustee or trustees as specified in the trust instrument.

16 Said council shall be a duly licensed private non-profit organi-  
17 zation under the laws of the Commonwealth in order to be eligible  
18 under this section. The council and/or its trustees shall be  
19 responsible for the negotiation, implementation, administration  
20 and all obligations and liabilities arising out of the contract.

Section 1. The Commission on the Administration of the Government shall be composed of the following members: . . .

Section 3. The Commission shall submit its report to the President and the Senate within the time specified in the resolution creating it.

Section 5. The Commission shall have the right to subpoena any person who has information concerning the matters under investigation, and to require the production of any documents or records in the possession, custody, or control of such person.

Section 6. The Commission shall have the right to hold confidential sessions and to receive confidential information from any person who may have information concerning the matters under investigation.
