**AN ACT REGULATING THE COLOR OF EMERGENCY LIGHTS ON POLICE VEHICLES.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The first paragraph of Section 7 of Chapter 90 of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the 15th sentence, and  
3 inserting in place thereof the following new sentence: — No motor  
4 vehicle so operated, except fire apparatus, ambulances, or school  
5 buses, shall display a red light in the direction which the vehicle is  
6 proceeding or facing; and no motor vehicle, except a vehicle used  
7 solely for official business by any police department of the Com-  
8 monwealth or its political subdivisions or any railroad police  
9 department within the Commonwealth or college or university  
10 police department whose officers are appointed by the Commis-  
11 sioner of Public Safety pursuant to chapter 147, section 10G, and  
12 subject to such special rules and regulations applicable to such  
13 college or university police department as the registrar may pre-  
14 scribe, shall display a blue light in the direction toward which the  
15 vehicle is proceeding or facing provided, however, that the regis-  
16 trar by rules and regulations may permit other vehicles to display  
17 blue lights.
