AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADDITION OF GENERAL SERVICES TO THE RANGE OF HOME CARE SERVICES NOW PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ELDER AFFAIRS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
