## SENATE No. 844

By Mr. Harold, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 844) of Paul D. Harold for legislation to further regulate school aid to certain regional school districts. Education.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-five.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING SCHOOL AID TO CERTAIN REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Whereas. The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith funding for the support of regional vocational school districts, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Notwithstanding any provision of subsection (b) of section 1
- sixteen D of chapter seventy-one of the General Laws to the 2
- contrary, during the nineteen hundred and eighty-four fiscal 3
- and nineteen hundred and eighty-five fiscal years "regional 4
- reimbursable expenditures" shall be defined as follows: -5
- "Regional reimbursable expenditures", the total amount ex-6
- pended by a regional school district during a fiscal year for 7
- the support of public schools during said year exclusive of ex-8
- penditures for transportation, for food for school food service 9
- programs and capital outlay, after deducting therefrom any 10
- receipts for tuition, other than tuition paid by post-secondary 11
- students as defined under section thirty-seven A of chapter 12 seventy-four of the General Laws, receipts from the federal
- 13 government, the proceeds of any invested funds, and grants.
- 14
- gifts and receipts from any other source, to the extent that such 15 receipts are applicable to such expenditures; provided. 16
- however, that in the first year that a regional school district 17
- is formed or the year in which a regional school district ex-18

pands "regional reimbursable expenditures" shall mean the 19 total amount expended by a regional school district in the fiscal 20 year during which time the regional school district expands 21 22 for the support of the public schools during said year exclusive of expenditures for transportation, for food for school food ser-23 vice programs, and for capital outlays, after deducting 24 therefrom any receipts for tuition, receipts from the federal 25 government, the proceeds of any invested funds and grants. 26 gifts and receipts from any other source, to the extent that such 27 receipts are applicable to such expenditures; provided, 28 however that amount received by a regional school district 29 30 under this section as school aid shall not be so deducted. The

commissioner of education may, by regulation, further define

the expenditures and receipts that may be included hereunder.
