

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF OAKHAM TO CONVEY  
CERTAIN PREMISES TO THE EVANGELICAL CONGREGATIONAL  
CHURCH OF OAKHAM. Chap.377

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

The town of Oakham is hereby authorized to convey to the Evangelical Congregational Church of Oakham a certain parcel of land situate in said town and bounded and described as follows:— Starting at a point at the intersection of Ware Corner road, Coldbrook road and Maple street, thence running in a northeasterly direction a distance of 78.8 feet, thence turning and running in a southeasterly direction a distance of 172 feet  $\pm$ , thence turning and running in a southwesterly direction a distance of 75.0 feet, thence turning and running in a northwesterly direction a distance of 180 feet  $\pm$  to point of beginning, said land being shown on Plan of Land to be acquired by the Evangelical Congregational Church of Oakham, Mass., drawn by R. H. Lonergan, C.E., dated February, 1954. Said town is hereby authorized to convey to said church all its right, title and interest in any portion of the building now standing on said premises. *Approved May 4, 1954.*

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CORPORATE POWERS OF THE MALDEN  
POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION. Chap.378

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Upon the death of any pensioned officer of the police department of the city of Malden, who is a member of The Malden Police Relief Association, and who is entitled to receive benefits under the constitution and by-laws of said corporation, the amount of mortuary benefit to which he was entitled at the time of his retirement as an active member of said police department shall be paid to such person as the deceased member may have designated in writing and which is on file in the secretary's records; provided, however, that the person so designated shall be the wife, betrothed, child by legal adoption, parent by legal adoption, blood relative of, or a person dependent upon, such deceased member. In the event that the named beneficiary has died, or is illegally designated, then the benefit shall be paid to the wife, children, mother, father, brother, sister or next of kin in the order named. *Approved May 4, 1954.*

PUBLIC WORKS TO MAKE CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS IN THE
