AN ACT RELATIVE TO MILEAGE FEES FOR CERTAIN STATE POLICE
WITNESSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 53B of Chapter 262 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the following sentence:
- 4 Any such officer who attends court in a criminal case pen-
- 5 ding in any court of the commonwealth shall be paid at the rate
- 6 of twenty-two cents a mile for travel from his residence to said
- 7 court and return for each day's attendance, except that travel
- 8 allowance shall not be allowed when such travel is made in
- 9 state-owned vehicles.
