

SENATE No. 2121

[Order (Lewis) relative to reviving and continuing a joint special committee established to make an investigation and study of public employee contributory retirement laws (Senate, No. 2121). Rules.]

SENATE, February 25, 1985.

1 Ordered, That the Special Committee established under the provisions
2 of an order adopted by the House of Representatives on the fourth day
3 of April, nineteen hundred and eighty-two, and by the Senate on the
4 twenty-seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and eighty-two (see House
5 5865 of 1982) and continued and revived by the provisions of an order
6 adopted by the House of Rperesentatives on the twentieth day of March,
7 nineteen hundred and eighty-four, and by the Senate on the ninth day of
8 April, nineteen hundred and eighty-four (see House 1630 of 1984), make
9 an investigation and study and in the course of its investigation and study
10 consider the subject matter of current senate and house documents relative
11 to the public employee contributory retirement law, Chapter 32 of the
12 General Laws, including, but not limited to, ordinary and accidental dis-
13 ability pensions, early retirement incentives, expansion of retirement
14 groups, expansion of the heart and lung law, finding and investment of
15 public employee pension funds, judicial pensions, and other matters
16 which impact said Chapter 32 and various related statutes.

THE CONSTITUTION

IN THE STATE OF ALABAMA

CHAPTER I

The legislative power shall be vested in the Legislature, which shall consist of the Senate and the House of Representatives. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment and the trial of all impeachments shall be held in the Senate. The Legislature shall have the power to elect or remove the judges of the Supreme Court and the Justices of the Peace. The Legislature shall have the power to elect or remove the members of the Board of Education and the members of the Board of Public Safety. The Legislature shall have the power to elect or remove the members of the Board of Prison Commissioners and the members of the Board of Pardons and Paroles. The Legislature shall have the power to elect or remove the members of the Board of Land Commissioners and the members of the Board of Roads and Highways. The Legislature shall have the power to elect or remove the members of the Board of Public Health and the members of the Board of Public Safety.
