By Mr. Wetmore, a petition of Robert D. Wetmore (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Holland to establish a revolving account for the purpose of running the Holland landfill. Local Affairs.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HOLLAND TO ESTABLISH A REVOLVING ACCOUNT FOR THE PURPOSE OF RUNNING THE HOLLAND LANDFILL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 53 of
2 Chapter 44 of the General Laws to the contrary, the town of
3 Holland is hereby authorized to establish in its treasury a
4 special account which shall be known as the "Holland Land-
5 fill Account". Into such account there shall be deposited the
6 receipts, contributions and other monies associated with the
7 town services provided for the and/or because of the Holland
8 Landfill, so-called, except appropriations, and any and all such
9 funds received by the town treasurer shall be kept separate
10 from any other monies. Such funds or property and interest
11 thereon shall be expended from said account at the direction
12 of the Holland Board of Health and approved by the Board of
13 Selectmen without appropriation in such and at such times as
14 shall, in the discretion of said Boards, best serve and promote
15 the purposes for which said program was established.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
