AN ACT RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF VOLUNTEERISM TO ALL OUR CITIZENS AND ENCOURAGING GREATER VOLUNTEER ACTIVITY BY ACCEPTING WORK PERFORMED ON A VOLUNTEER BASIS AS LEGITIMATE WORK EXPERIENCE ON APPLICATIONS FOR EMPLOYMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after Section 52A, the following: —
- 3 *Section 52B.* Every application for employment which requires
- 4 the applicant to set forth his experience shall contain a statement
- 5 that the applicant may include any work performed on a volunteer
- 6 basis.

5. The amount of the bonds to be issued shall be
6. \$1,000,000.
