

Accompanying the seventh recommendation of the Executive Office of Elder Affairs (House, No. 74). Insurance.

**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Six.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO DEVELOPING PRIVATE LONG TERM CARE INSURANCE.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of four  
2 members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the  
3 Speaker, two members of the Senate, appointed by the Presi-  
4 dent, the Secretary of Administration and Finance or his  
5 designee, the Secretary of Elder Affairs or his designee, the  
6 Insurance or his designee, the Commissioner of Public Health or  
7 his designee; and three persons representing consumers, three  
8 representatives from the insurance industry, three representatives  
9 of long term care providers, all to be appointed by the Governor;  
10 shall be established for the purpose of making an investigation and  
11 study of private long term care insurance. Said Commission shall  
12 study the level of need for private long term care insurance,  
13 barriers blocking the development of such insurance, and strategies  
14 to encourage the development of such insurance in the Common-  
15 wealth.

16 Said Commission shall report their findings and recommenda-  
17 tions to the Governor and to the General Court one year after the  
18 Commission is established.
