

By Mr. DeNucci of Newton, petition of A. Joseph DeNucci for legislation to further regulate the operations of the Commission for the Blind. Human Services and Elderly Affairs.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE OPERATIONS OF THE COMMISSION
FOR THE BLIND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Said chapter 6 is hereby further amended by striking out section
2 149, as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the following
3 section: —

4 Section 149. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter sixty-
5 six and chapter 30, section 42, the commissioner shall have the
6 power to establish and to enforce reasonable rules and regulations
7 governing the custody, use, preservation and destruction of the
8 records, papers, files and communications of the commission con-
9 cerning blind persons. No other department, bureau or agency of
10 the commonwealth or of any political subdivision thereof, which,
11 under any provision of law has been furnished with names of
12 recipients of aid to the blind, shall permit the publication of such
13 names or make use thereof for purposes not directly connected
14 with the administration of aid to the blind.
