AN ACT REQUIRING A BOND OF AT LEAST ONE MILLION DOLLARS AS A CONDITION TO RECEIVING A LICENSE TO TRANSPORT LIQUID CHLORINE THROUGH DENSELY POPULATED AREAS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The first paragraph of section 58 of chapter 21 of the General  
2 Laws, as amended by section 3 of chapter 110 of the acts of 1975, is  
3 hereby further amended by inserting after the second sentence, the  
4 following sentences: — Any license given by the board under this  
5 section for the transporting of liquid chlorine through densely  
6 populated areas shall be subject to the condition that the licensee  
7 shall post a bond in the amount of at least one million dollars. The  
8 provisions of this section relative to the posting of such bond shall  
9 not prohibit any city or town from requiring a larger bond.
